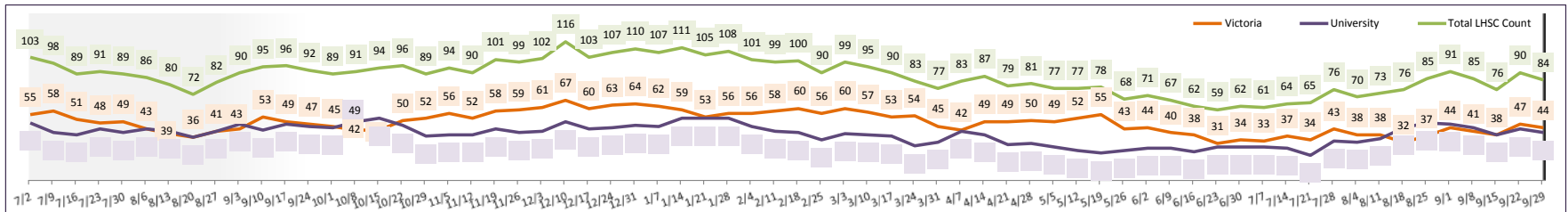

Total Number of Active ALC Designated Patients (source LHSC)



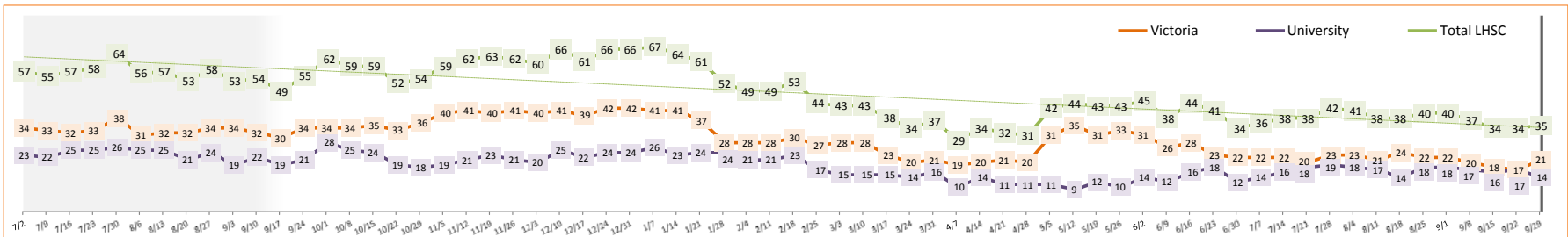
*In September we saw the highest number of patients who were ALC since March 2012. This has offered us the opportunity to do in depth patient case reviews with the team.*
