Spiritual Care Clinician – Stratford (Temporary Part Time)

The Opportunity:

As a member of the Hospice Palliative Outreach Team, the Spiritual Care Clinician is concerned with the psychological, emotional and spiritual well-being of the persons who are dying, and their families, as they deal with issues of self-esteem, adaptation to the illness and its consequences, social function and relationships, communication, and spiritual suffering. Assisting and supporting conversations essential for end-of-life, decision-making is included in this role. This position reports to the Huron Perth Hospice Palliative Outreach Manager.

The Huron Perth Hospice Palliative Outreach Team is a secondary level consult team that works in partnership with primary care providers (nurses, physicians, etc.) to provide support and consultation in symptom management including psychosocial and spiritual aspects to care.

The Hospice Palliative Outreach Team supports primary care providers to support their patient in their communities, prevent avoidable hospital or emergency visits and to help meet the care needs of the individual and their family as their illness progresses.

The Outreach Team Members:

- Collaborate in the assessments and management of individuals and families requiring hospice palliative care. This may include direct patient contact or consultation support to health care providers and team members.
- Coordinates educational programs in collaboration with the team.
- Provides leadership in the evaluation of individual and family outcomes.
- Contributes to the knowledge of the team, sharing expertise and current evidence informed practices and information.

What Can I Expect To Do?

As a Spiritual Care Clinician, you will:

- Establish and maintain effective relationships with patients, service providers and other partners to deliver the highest quality patient care.
- Act as a spokesperson as required, and interpret the role of the LHIN to patients, health care professionals and to
 the public. Ensure positive public relations and effective co-ordination of services across sectors through ongoing
 liaison and participation on internal and external committees.
- Answer any questions or concerns of the patient and caregiver and provide LHIN VIP phone number for support.
